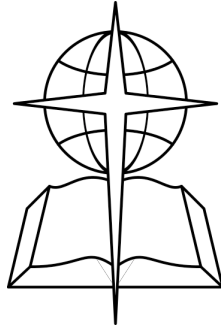
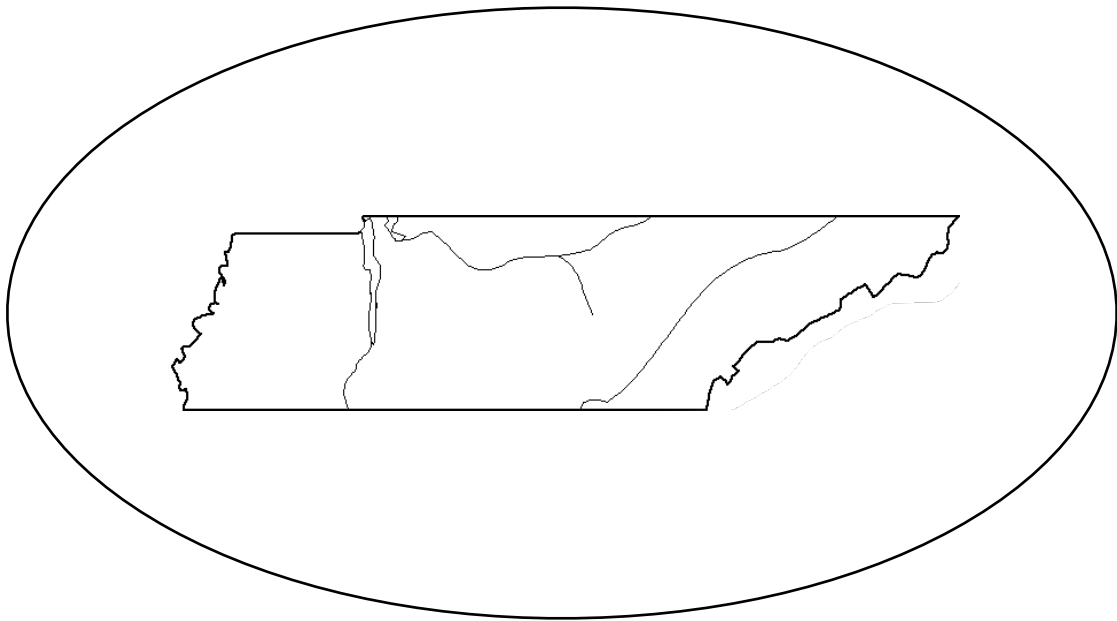

Tennessee Baptist Convention Annual Associational Report

This past year has been a year of steady progress for our Tennessee Baptist network of churches. Because of the work of our churches and Associations, the sun never sets without Tennessee Baptists impacting lost people for Christ across our state and around this globe.

Three milestones:

- 1) First, the **Missions Mobilization Center** that has been a labor of love for three years was dedicated on June 1. Tennessee Baptists volunteering their skills and time poured themselves into making the MMC in Mt. Juliet a reality. Hundreds of thousands of dollars were saved because of the tens of thousands of man-hours that our great army of volunteers put into this facility. The MMC is going to be a tremendous asset to Disaster Relief ministry and Baptist Builders for many years to come. We deeply appreciate the late Don Davis and his precious wife, Ann, as well as their family sacrificially donating the land and giving of themselves to see the Missions Mobilization Center become a reality. And we can never adequately thank all the churches and individuals who gave financially to this project.
- 2) As I write this letter, the **Chapel at Linden Valley Conference Center** is very near completion. The floods of 2010 ravaged the Tabernacle, our former worship center at Camp Linden. But again, because people were willing to give of their time, energy, talents, and resources, a new chapel will soon come on line for the campers at this wonderful facility. Tim Bearden, Senior Manager, provided incredible oversight during the most difficult days of his life. Thank you, Tim.
- 3) The first three years of my tenure as Executive Director have been spent on sharpening our focus for the future. With the declines all across the Southern Baptist Convention, we must think again how we are doing Great Commission work in the 21st Century. We cannot continue to do “business as usual.” The report of the **Vision 2021 Transition Team** that will be presented to the messengers at *Summit, The Gathering of Tennessee Baptists* in Chattanooga will reflect a bold, new direction for our Convention. The focus will be on the mission of impacting lostness in Tennessee and around the world. We will have relationships strengthened around strategy, not tradition. And, by focusing on a few priorities, we will do our work with greater excellence.

With the great challenges facing all of us doing Kingdom work, we must lean on one another and our Lord like never before. I am extremely hopeful about the days ahead. I believe that Tennessee, “The Volunteer State,” can help lead the way in the Southern Baptist Convention in intentional evangelism and demonstrated discipleship. I believe our focus must be on revitalizing and strengthening our churches as we help one another strategically plant more churches in our state. And, we must give purposeful, great attention to developing Christ-exalting, Bible-centered pastoral leaders for the future. The Savior and lost souls are counting on our very best.

It is a joy to be with you on this journey.

Union University

We are a grateful community at Union University for the numerous ways that God has blessed the work of our hands during the 2012-13 academic year, including an enrollment increase for the sixteenth straight year. Annual non-duplicating enrollment exceeded 5,000 for the third year in a row.

Union was pleased to invest the generous cooperative program gifts from the churches across the Tennessee Baptist Convention in the lives of hundreds of students who attended Union University during this past year. Many of the dollars went directly to provide scholarship assistance for students whose parents serve on the mission field, in local churches, and with denominational agencies.

Union has responded to invitations from the IMB and NAMB to create a special masters program in Christian Studies for missionaries and bi-vocational pastors. We are honored to serve the Baptist family in this way with an emphasis on missional, Kingdom-focused higher education.

Union continued to be recognized for high quality academics by *U.S. News and World Report* and numerous other publications. The recognitions were more significant than ever.

Nearly 1,150 students graduated from Union University this past year. These students will serve in Tennessee, in this region, across the country, and around the globe.

Union provided extensive leadership for the efforts to advance Christ-centered higher education through the publication of the volume on *Faith and Learning* (Baptist & Holman) and the multi-volume series on “Reclaiming the Christian Intellectual Tradition” (Crossway). In many ways Union stands as a leader in the Baptist and evangelical worlds in helping to shape distinctive Christ-centered higher education for the 21st Century.

Several hundred students were involved in dozens of global mission opportunities, local church and para-church ministries, and community service efforts.

We are thankful for our long-standing partnership with the Tennessee Baptist Convention. We pray for God’s ongoing blessings to rest on Union University as we seek to advance the cause of Christ-centered higher education in the Baptist tradition. We are grateful to the churches of the TBC and the friends of Union University across the state who provide prayer, encouragement, and financial support for our work, particularly for our students, staff, faculty and trustees.

Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes, Inc. 2013 Association Report

The State of Tennessee is facing a significant challenge in providing an adequate number of Foster Parent Resource Homes for the constantly growing number of at risk children. The Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes has responded to this need by establishing a working relationship with DCS to recruit, train and engage Christian families to provide safe, strong homes for children in DCS custody.

An important part of the TBCH Foster Care Initiative is called the Caring Community Ministry (CCM). It is designed to be a lay-led ministry for support of foster families where they live and worship. It is important that families that open their homes have the necessary local support in order to be successful and help change the trajectory of the lives of at-risk children. Through the CCM that assistance can be provided to the Foster Care family.

TBCH is committed to providing the necessary support for the churches to ensure that the Caring Community Ministry concept will be a success for the children in care, the Foster Parents and church members who want to be a part of a mission endeavor without needing a passport or having to travel long distances. We hope that churches across Tennessee will see the CCM as an opportunity to reach out and minister in this critical way in their own communities.

During this year, your TBCH ministry has served approximately 200 children and their families through the residential care program. Additionally, 4 children have been led to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, and 8 students provided for as they pursue their college or post-secondary education.

The past few years have presented challenges as we have attempted to meet the needs of children in crisis. A decision was made many years ago that we would not accept government funds to underwrite this work. As we step out in faith to partner with DCS to care for more children we continue to trust God, working through His people, to meet our needs. We ask that you prayerfully consider your response to both the Mother's Day Offering and the Cooperative Program.

THANK YOU Tennessee Baptists for your prayers, your volunteer service, and your gifts. Together, we are making a difference for the Kingdom!

Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes

In telling the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus stressed that the Samaritan looked upon the needy man beside the road with compassion and then ministered and “took care of him”. The man was a stranger but a fellow human being. Your Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes ministry rarely has to deal with abused individuals, thankfully, but does welcome in the elderly, the frail, and the disabled who need someone to minister to them and take care of them. They may come to us as strangers, but it isn’t long until they are family and our residences they call “home”. They find compassion and care in the name of Christ and learn that Tennessee Baptists across the state are praying for them and contributing resources for their support. There is an entire network of Baptist believers who take Jesus’ words seriously about ministering to “the least of these” (Matt. 25:40).

Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes on any given day provides residences for 55 intellectually disabled persons in six group homes at four locations and another 300+ senior adults on three campuses. Your Cooperative Program and Father’s Day Offering gifts help make these residences possible. Additionally, for two weeks each summer a Special Friends Camp is held for intellectually disabled persons. This year there were about 270 campers served by some 70 staff. The camps are held at the TBC Carson Springs and Linden Valley Conference Centers and are underwritten to a large extent by the Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions.

Quality of life and quality of care are stressed in every area of the ministry. The staff serves with the realization that every person is created in the image of God and one for whom Christ gave his life. Each resident and camper is treated with respect and every effort possible is made to insure that they enjoy a full life rather than endure a painful and lonely existence. Activities and opportunities for worship and fellowship are essential to the well-being of those we have the blessing of serving. The nursing home and assisted living center in Lenoir City along with the group homes receive first-rate evaluations by government regulatory bodies. More importantly, families and friends of residents continue to express great appreciation for the care given to their loved one. The independent living residences continue to be places of welcome and development of friendships. Living may be complicated due to disabilities and aging, but life can still be robust and meaningful. That is the difference Christ makes. It is the difference Tennessee Baptists make.

Please continue to pray for and undergird your vital ministry to senior adults and intellectually disabled adults through Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes.

PROPOSED OFFICERS & COMMITTEES 2013-2014
LINK UP COVENANT BETWEEN
JUDSON BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
STEWART CO. BAPTIST ASSOCIATION
TRUETT BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

We, Judson Baptist Association, Stewart Baptist Association and Truett Baptist Association (hereafter called “The Associations”) covenant to link-up together to reach the lost in our area through cooperation, maximizing resources, minimizing meetings and empowering decision-makers to impact the Kingdom of God.

We, The Associations, covenant to jointly fund a Director of Missions (hereafter called “DOM”) and staff through individual and joint budgets with all funds for DOM and staff administered through the Truett Baptist Association Treasurer.

We, the Associations, covenant to maintain an advisory committee consisting of the moderator of each association and one member from each association elected by each Executive Board to coordinate between the individual Executive Boards, the DOM, the Tennessee Baptist Convention (TBC) and the North American Mission Board (NAMB).

We, the Associations, covenant to work through the Advisory Committee to establish a job description for the DOM and staff, monitor performance, access financial, physical and spiritual needs of the DOM and staff.

We, the Associations, covenant to establish an Area Program Committee to work with the DOM to coordinate all joint meetings and training. The Area Program Committee shall consist of two members from each association selected by the Nominating Committee of each association and elected at the Annual Business Meeting of each association. The initial Area Program Committee shall be elected by the Executive Board’s of each association.

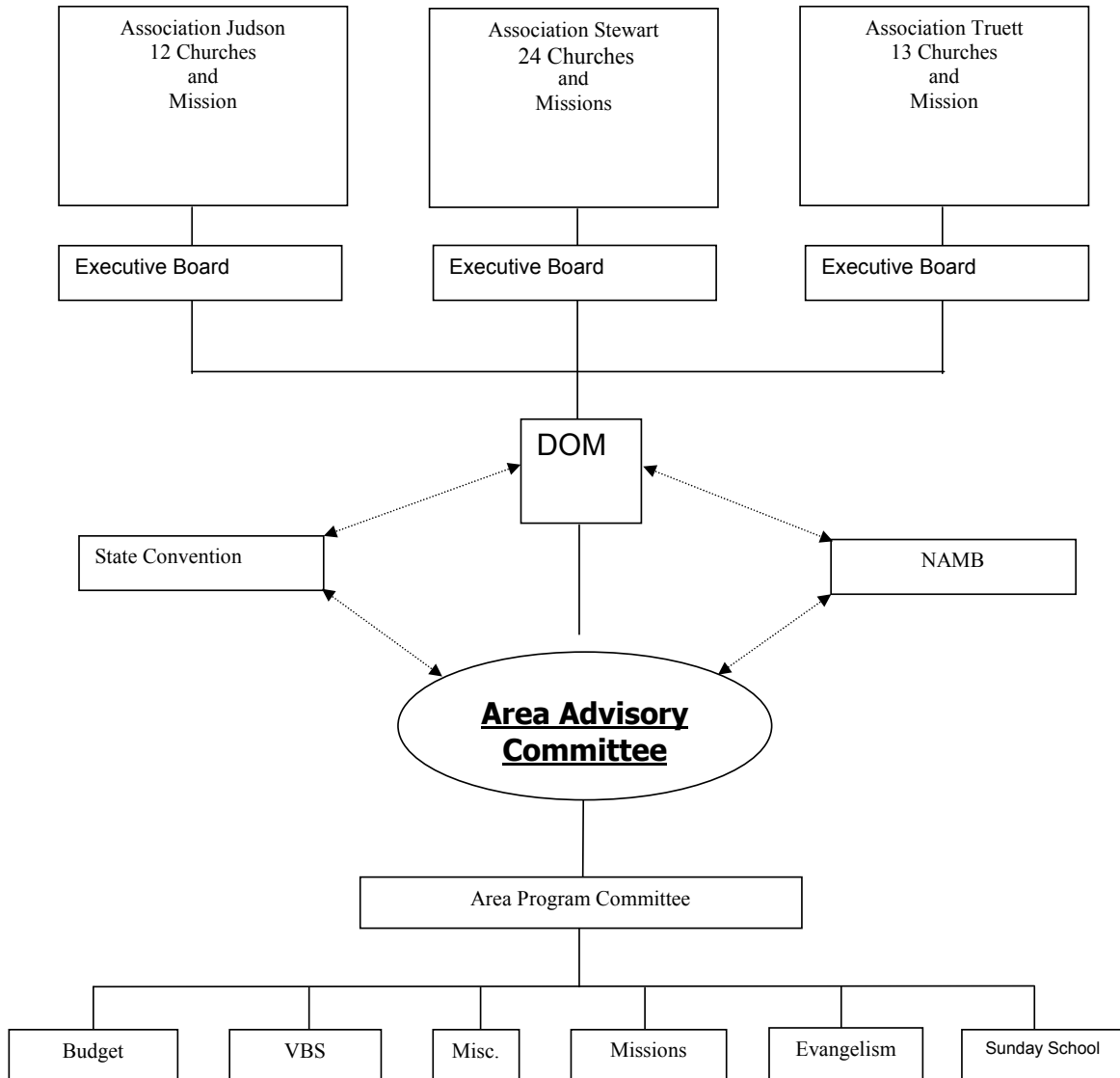

**Annual Report for Associations in the Tennessee Baptist Convention
Tennessee Woman's Missionary Union - September 1, 2012 through August 31, 2013**

"The Story Lives On" was the 2012-13 emphasis theme for Woman's Missionary Union based on Acts 4:20. Tennessee WMU met in annual session March 16, 2013 at the Gatlinburg Convention Center. The theme was "Speak Out" with Rhonda Rhea, New Hope author from St. Louis, Missouri as the keynote speaker. Debby Akerman, President of national WMU from South Carolina, brought historical vignettes to each session highlighting the 125-year history of Tennessee WMU. Bobby Turner from First Baptist Church, Lenoir City was re-elected President of TN WMU. Other officers elected include: Elaine Pearson from Lebanon, Recording Secretary; and Vice Presidents: Delores Coffey, Morristown; Carmen Westerman, Dickson; and Andrea Young, Bolivar. State Acteens Advisory Panelists for 2012-13 included Lydia Huggins, Southwestern Baptist Church, Erwin; Sabrina Thompson, Black Oak Baptist Church, Clinton; and Susanna Clouse, Caney Fork Baptist Church, Cookeville. Registration for Missions Get-Together and Connection totaled 2,112. The annual offering totaled \$33,535.64 with 90% designated to design, construct, furnish and endow the missionary house being built in Mt. Juliet in 2013 to celebrate the 125th anniversary of TN WMU; 10% benefited Tennessee N Touch Endowment. The goal of raising \$300,000 for the missionary house was achieved. The participants also contributed items to support 24 Christian Women and Men's Job Corps sites in Tennessee.

A groundbreaking ceremony was conducted April 6 at the site where the missionary house will be at 6220 John Hager Road, Mt. Juliet. Construction began in July.

Staff changes during the year included the addition of Brian Holt as the volunteer State RA Coordinator; the resignation of Christy Dyer as Preschool, Children and Student Ministry Specialist; and the addition of Julie Heath to assume that responsibility; and the loss of Jennifer Ferguson as Ministry Assistant through staff reduction.

Currently there are 24 Christian Women's Job Corps and Christian Men's Job Corps sites in Tennessee. The state coordinator is Tracey Gholson from Brook Hollow Baptist Church, Nashville.

Project HELP: Human Exploitation (the unethical, selfish use of human beings for the satisfaction of personal desires and/or profitable advantage) continues to be the critical social issue for WMU through 2014.

The 2012 goal for the Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions was \$1,550,000. The theme for the 2012 Week of Prayer for State Missions was "My Tennessee, My Mission, His Message" taken from Matthew 25:35-40. As of July 31, the total amount given to the 2012 GOTM was \$1,434,226. In addition to promoting the Golden Offering and the Cooperative Program, TN WMU is also responsible for promoting special offerings which this year totaled more than \$16,444,609:

- \$10,707,292 Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions (12/1/11 through 11/30/12)
- \$ 4,303,091 Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions (3/1/12 through 2/28/13)

Constitution

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Association shall be called the Truett Association of Missionary Baptist.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

1. To foster fellowship among the churches cooperating with the Association.
2. To assist the churches in strengthening their programs of enlistment, evangelism, teaching, and training.
3. To encourage churches in the establishment of missions and new churches.
4. To promote these programs of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention as it may deem proper.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

The Membership of this Association shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches with the Truett Association on the following basis.

1. Each church, regardless of size, may have three (3) messengers.
2. Each church may have one (1) additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof over 100 members.
3. No church may have over ten (10) messengers.
4. All pastors of the churches, officers of the Association and members of the standing committees shall be members of this Association. Churches may be admitted to membership in this Association by a two-thirds majority vote after a petitionary letter has been received by the Credentials Committee. and upon said committee's recommendation.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer and any other officers that the Association may deem necessary in order to perform the work which needs to be done. The officers shall be elected on the first day of the Association's Annual Meeting, and their tour of duty will begin at the dose of the Annual Session. The Moderator may not be eligible for election if he has served two or any part of two terms until at least a year has passed.

ARTICLE V - AUTHORITY

The Association claims no jurisdiction over the churches, and shall exercise no authority over them; however, it shall be the duty of the Association to offer fraternal council to any church in need of the same, upon their request. The Association will reserve the right to refuse to recognize messengers from any church which persists in disorderly practices.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1. This Association shall have an Executive Board composed of the regular officers of the Association, and other elected officers, Pastors and Chairman of the Standing Committees, along with two elected laymen from each church.
2. This committee shall meet on the fourth Monday night, in October, January, April, July and August. (July shall be the planning meeting). November, January, March, May and June be given to promoting Sunday School, Discipleship Training, Brotherhood, W.M.U. and Stewardship. Only urgent business will be introduced at an emphasis meeting.

ARTICLE VII - PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

1. The By-Laws may be added or the Constitution altered by a two-thirds majority of those present at any regular meeting of the Association. Said recommendations shall be presented to the Executive Committee at the meeting prior to the annual meeting.
2. Robert's Rule of Order shall be the governing procedure.

BY-LAWS

- I. One-half of all messengers attending the Association meeting shall constitute a quorum.
- II. Brethren not messengers of the Association and visiting Brethren invited to sit with the Association may be privileged to discuss but not the right to vote.
- III. The Nominating Committee shall make recommendations for all officers and committee members of Standing Committee.
- IV. The Moderator shall appoint any committees not otherwise provided for.
- V. The Moderator shall have the same privilege, as other members, provided he vacate the chair. While occupying the chair, he may vote only in case of a tie. These rules shall apply to the Assistant Moderator while he is occupying the chair.
- VI. The Association year closes August 31st. Church letters shall be in hand of Clerk by September 15th.

- VII. The Annual Association shall meet Thursday evening after the last Sunday in September.
- VIII. The Executive Board shall be the governing body of the Association between Annual Meetings and shall meet on the fourth Monday night of October, January, April and August with the Moderator given the authority to call special meetings of the Executive Board when needed, upon 7 days advance notice.
- IX. An Associational Calendar of events for the coming year shall be prepared and printed in minutes each year.
- X. All resolutions and reports shall be presented in writing, signed by person offering such report and shall become a part of the permanent record.
- XI. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be paid for services rendered by the amount set by the Budget and Finance Committee.
- XII. The following committees compose the standing committees of this Association
- 1) Promotion - All elected officers compose this committee and the Vice Moderator will serve as Chairman.
 - 2) Missions - This committee shall work with the Director of Missions in various projects in the Association, and shall be composed of five members.
 - 3) Budget and Finance - This committee will have two Pastors, Associational Treasurer and two other laymen.
 - 4) Program - This committee shall have three members, including Associational Clerk.
 - 5) Nominating - This committee shall nominate all officers, standing committees and fill any vacancies, which may occur. This committee shall be composed of five members.
 - 6) Credentials and Doctrine - This committee shall examine Credentials of new Churches and make the necessary recommendation after examination, and also counsel with any church when requested.
- Each committee shall make a report of the work accomplished and of the plans for the future to the Executive Committee at the four (4) Executive Board Committee meetings. Report of Committees to be made to the Executive Committee at the meeting prior to the Annual Associational Meeting.
- XIII. The Moderator shall be ex officio members of all committees, standing or special.
- XIV. The By-Laws may be amended or changed at any time by a majority vote of those present - Executive Committee or Annual Association.

WORKING AGREEMENT

BETWEEN TRUETT ASSOCIATION OF MISSIONARY BAPTIST AND ASSOCIATION DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

- I. POSITION TITLE:** Association Director of Missions will be the official title, hereinafter called DOM of the Truett Association of Missionary Baptist, hereinafter called the Association.
- II. BASIC FUNCTION:** Provide leadership in the work of the Association in the interest of strengthening the cooperative Baptist witness throughout the area.
- III. QUALIFICATIONS:**
- 1) Personal dedication and consistent Christian living.
 - 2) A sense of call to mission service.
 - 3) Adequate educational preparation, preferably college and seminary training or the equivalent in experience and other training.
 - 4) Thorough knowledge of the work of a Southern Baptist Church.
 - 5) Knowledge of Association work from personal experience as a DOM or as a participating pastor or other Church leader.
 - 6) Reasonable knowledge of Southern Baptist denominational life and willingness to continue to learn.
 - 7) Ability to relate effectively to rural and small town Pastors and Churches.
- IV. RESPONSIBILITIES:**
- 4) Work with Association leaders and committees in planning and conducting activities designed to strengthen the churches according to their needs, and to maintain effective mission ministries in the area.
 - 5) Lead in planning and coordination of a calendar of Association activities to be presented each year to the annual meeting business session and printed in the minutes of the annual meeting as already provided for the By-Law number of the By-Laws Association.
 - 6) Lead in training Association organizational leaders and committees.
 - 7) Publish monthly a newsletter of the Association. The newsletter should contain news of interest, highlights of Executive Board action, treasurer's report, upcoming dates of Association activities, and other information and inspiration at the discretion of the DOM.
 - 8) Provide counsel and help as reasonably requested by Pastors and Churches.

- 9) Assist in stewardship development in order to undergird the work of the Association and encourage growth in the support of mission causes through the Cooperative Program.
- 10) Assist in maintaining a Biblical evangelism concern in the Association.
- 11) Serve as denomination contact person in the Association relaying quickly news of interest to churches by use of monthly newsletter, reports to the Executive Board, or other communication as considered appropriate by the DOM.
- 12) A report of DOM activities and concerns will be made at each Executive Board meeting and an annual report will be presented by the DOM to the Association Clerk for inclusion in the "Book of Reports" for the annual meeting. The DOM will report regularly to the Missions Department of the TBC.
- 13) The DOM will demonstrate true commitment to the purpose of Association as prescribed in Article II, "Purpose", of the Constitution of the Association.

V. CALL:

- 1) The call and employment of the DOM be by approval of the Association Executive Board. The Association Executive Board. The Association Missions Committee will serve as search committee when a vacancy of the position occurs and will recommend a nominee for the position to the Executive board.
- 2) The call of the DOM of the Association is a indefinite one. The position of DOM himself, or the Executive Board. The DOM will give the Executive Board thirty (30) days notice if resignation is desired; and the Executive Board will give the DOM sixty (60) days notice if the DOM's resignation is called for.
- 3) The amount of salary and allowances will be worked out and presented for approval annually. It is suggested that the Missions committee and the Budget and Finance committee work together when negotiating a pay package with the DOM.
- 4) Four (4) weeks per year will be allowed, off the field, for revivals, world mission conferences and other such activities. Consideration of the Association calendar is suggested when such activities are scheduled by the DOM.
- 5) The DOM will be allowed two weeks paid vacation each year, with three weeks after five years of service. Vacation time cannot accumulate one year to the next, and payment will not be made for time not taken. Consideration of Association activities is suggested in the scheduling of vacation time by the DOM.
- 6) One day of sick leave with pay shall accumulate for each month of service to a total of ninety (90) days. Sick leave is intended for use by the DOM in case of his illness or that of his immediate family that requires his attention or assistance, including funerals. Sick leave will be forfeited at the time of the DOM's resignation, or dismissal. The Association will not make payment for accumulated sick leave.
- 7) The DOM shall be entitled to receive and keep honorariums from revivals and from supply preaching when the church normally would provide and honorarium.
- 8) The work schedule may vary from week to week as need arises in the Association and Churches.
- 9) Due to the size of the Association and the rural setting of most of our Churches this agreement does not propose to regulate how many times the DOM can supply the pulpit, occasionally or successively in each Church, however, it is intended that the DOM will serve any Church as interim Pastor, but rather assist as requested by the Church in securing pulpit supply so that DOM time and attention can be equitably shared with other churches and Association responsibilities. It is suggested that the DOM compile and maintain a current list of licensed and ordained ministers, and lay speaker in the Association that are available for supply work.
- 10) The employment of the DOM shall be considered full time.
- 11) The Association treasurer will be the payroll officer and the DOM will report to the treasurer when vacation time and sick leave is used, so a record of leave may be maintained.

VI. SUPERVISION:

- 1) The DOM will be basically "self supervised".
- 2) The Missions committee will serve as an advisory committee to the DOM in all matters pertaining to terms of employment and this agreement.
- 3) The Association Executive Board will direct the Missions committee and the DOM, and the Association will be the final authority pertaining to all matters of the agreement

VII. MISCELLANEOUS:

- 1) All other working agreements which have been made between this Association and other DOM's are null and void.
- 2) This agreement shall be recorded annually in the Association minutes and may be amended as necessary by the Executive Board or in the annual meetings. Two months notice should be given before amendments are made. The DOM will be informed in writing of any proposed amendments two months before action is taken.
