

Constitution

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Association shall be called the Truett Association of Missionary Baptist.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

- 1. To foster fellowship among the churches cooperating with the Association.
- 2. To assist the churches in strengthening their programs of enlistment, evangelism, teaching, and training.
- 3. To encourage churches in the establishment of missions and new churches.
- 4. To promote these programs of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention as it may deem proper.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

The Membership of this Association shall be composed of messengers elected by the churches with the Truett Association on the following basis.

- 1. Each church, regardless of size, may have three (3) messengers.
- 2. Each church may have one (1) additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof over 100 mem bers.
- 3. No church may have over ten (10) messengers.
- 4. All pastors of the churches, officers of the Association and members of the standing committees shall be members of this Association. Churches may be admitted to membership in this Association by a two-thirds majority vote after a petitionary letter has been received by the Credentials Committee. and upon said committee's recommendation.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator. Clerk and Treasurer and any other officers that the Association may deem necessary in order to perform the work which needs to be done. The officers shall be elected on the first day of the Association's Annual Meeting, and their tour of duty will begin at the dose of the Annual Session. The Moderator may not be eligible for election if he has served two or any part of two terms until at least a year has passed.

ARTICLE V - AUTHORITY

The Association claims no jurisdiction over the churches, and shall exercise no authority over them; however, it shall be the duty of the Association to offer fraternal council to any church in need of the same, upon their request. The Association will reserve the right to refuse to recognize messengers from any church which persists in disorderly practices.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 1. This Association shall have an Executive Board composed of the regular officers of the Association, and other elected officers, Pastors and Chairman of the Standing Committees, along with two elected laymen from each church.
- 2. This committee shall meet on the fourth Monday night, in October, January, April, July and August. (July shall be the planning meeting). November, January, March, May and June be given to promoting Sunday School, Discipl eship Training, Brotherhood, W.M.U. and Stewardship. Only urgent business will be introduced at an emphasis meeting.

ARTICLE VII - PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

- 1. The By-Laws may be added or the Constitution altered by a two-thirds majority of those present at any regular meet ing of the Association. Said recommendations shall be presented to the Executive Committee at the meeting prior to the annual meeting.
- 2. Robert's Rule of Order shall be the governing procedure.

BY-LAWS

I. One-half of all messengers attending the Association meeting shall constitute a quorum.

- II. Brethren not messengers of the Association and visiting Brethren invited to sit with the Association may be privileged to dis cussion but not the right to vote.
- III. The Nominating Committee shall make recommendations for all officers and committee members of Standing Committee.
- IV. The Moderator shall appoint any committees not otherwise provided for.
- V. The Moderator shall have the same privilege, as other members, provided he vacate the chair. While occupying the chair, he may vote only in case of a tie. These rules shall apply to the Assistant Moderator while he is occupying the chair.
- VI. The Association year closes August 31st. Church letters shall be in hand of Clerk by September 15th.

- VII. The Annual Association shall meet Thursday evening after the last Sunday in September.
- VIII. The Executive Board shall be the governing body of the Association between Annual Meetings and shall meet on the fourth Monday night of October, January, April and August with the Moderator given the au thority to call special meetings of the Executive Board when needed, upon 7 days advance notice.
- IX. An Associational Calendar of events for the coming year shall be prepared and printed in minutes each year.
- X. All resolutions and reports shall be presented in writing, signed by person offering such report and shall become a part of the permanent record.
- XI. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be paid for services rendered by the amount set by the Budget and Finance Committee.
- XII. The following committees compose the standing committees of this Association
 - 1) Promotion All elected officers compose this committee and the Vice Moderator will serve as Chairman.
 - 2) Missions This committee shall work with the Director of Missions in various projects in the Association, and shall be composed of five members.
 - 3) Budget and Finance This committee will have two Pastors, Associational Treasurer and two other laymen.
 - 4) Program This committee shall have three members, including Associational Clerk.
 - 5) Nominating This committee shall nominate all officers, standing committees and fill any vacancies, which may oc cur. This committee shall be composed of five members.
 - 6) Credentials and Doctrine This committee shall examine Credentials of new Churches and make the necessary rec ommendation after examination, and also counsel with any church when requested.

Each committee shall make a report of the work accomplished and of the plans for the future to the Executive Commit tee at the four (4) Executive Board Committee meetings. Report of Committees to be made to the Executive Committee at the meeting prior to the Annual Associational Meeting.

Xlll. The Moderator shall be ex officio members of all committees, standing or special.

XIV. The By-Laws may be amended or changed at any time by a majority vote of those present - Executive Committee or Annual Association.

WORKING AGREEMENT

BETWEEN TRUETT ASSOCIATION OF MISSIONARY BAPTIST AND ASSOCIATION DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

I. POSITION TITLE: Association Director of Missions will be the official title, hereinafter called DOM of the Truett Associa tion of Missionary Baptist, hereinafter called the Association.

II. BASIC FUNCTION: Provide leadership in the work of the

Association in the interest of strengthening the cooperative Baptist witness throughout the area.

III. QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1) Personal dedication and consistent Christian living.
- 2) A sense of call to mission service.
- 3) Adequate educational preparation, preferably college and seminary training or the equivalent in experience and other training.
- 4) Thorough knowledge of the work of a Southern Baptist Church.
- 5) Knowledge of Association work from personal experience as a DOM or as a participating pastor or other Church leader.
- 6) Reasonable knowledge of Southern Baptist denominational life and willingness to continue to learn.
- 7) Ability to relate effectively to rural and small town Pastors and Churches.

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 4) Work with Association leaders and committees in planning and conducting activities designed to strengthen the churches according to their needs, and to maintain effective mission ministries in the area.
- 5) Lead in planning and coordination of a calendar of Association activities to be presented each year to the annual meeting business session and printed in the minutes of the annual meeting as already provided for the By-Law number of the By-Laws Association.
- 6) Lead in training Association organizational leaders and committees.
- 7) Publish monthly a newsletter of the Association. The newsletter should contain news of interest, highlights of Ex ecutive Board action, treasurer's report, upcoming dates of Association activities, and other information and inspira tion at the discretion of the DOM.
- 8) Provide counsel and help as reasonably requested by Pastors and Churches.

- 9) Assist in stewardship development in order to undergird the work of the Association and encourage growth in the support of mission causes through the Cooperative Program.
- 10) Assist in maintaining a Biblical evangelism concern in the Association.
- 11) Serve as denomination contact person in the Association relaying quickly news of interest to churches by use of monthly newsletter, reports to the Executive Board, or other communication as considered appropriate by the DOM.
- 12) A report of DOM activities and concerns will be made at each Executive Board meeting and an annual report will be presented by the DOM to the Association Clerk for inclusion in the "Book of Reports" for the annual meeting. The DOM will report regularly to the Missions Department of the TBC.
- 13) The DOM will demonstrate true commitment to the purpose of Association as prescribed in Article II, "Purpose", of the Constitution of the Association.

V. CALL:

- The call and employment of the DOM be by approval of the Association Executive Board. The Association Executive Board. The Association Missions Committee will serve as search committee when a vacancy of the position occurs and will recommend a nominee for the position to the Executive board.
- 2) The call of the DOM of the Association is a indefinite one. The position of DOM himself, or the Executive Board. The DOM will give the Executive Board thirty (30) days notice if resignation is desired; and the Executive Board will give the DOM sixty (60) days notice if the DOM's resignation is called for.
- 3) The amount of salary and allowances will be worked out and presented for approval annually. It is suggested that the Missions committee and the Budget and Finance committee work together when negotiating a pay package with the DOM.
- 4) Four (4) weeks per year will be allowed, off the field, for revivals, world mission conferences and other such activities. Consideration of the Association calendar is suggested when such activities are scheduled by the DOM.
- 5) The DOM will be allowed two weeks paid vacation each year, with three weeks after five years of service. Vacation time cannot accumulate one year to the next, and payment will not be made for time not taken. Consideration of Association activities is suggested in the scheduling of vacation time by the DOM.
- 6) One day of sick leave with pay shall accumulate for each month of service to a total of ninety (90) days. Sick leave is intended for use by the DOM in case of his illness of that of his immediate family that requires his attention or assis tance, including funerals. Sick leave will be forfeited at the time of the DOM's resignation, or dismissal. The Association will not make payment for accumulates sick leave.
- 7) The DOM shall be entitles to receive and keep honorariums from revivals and from supply preaching when the church normally would provide and honorarium.
- 8) The work schedule may vary from week to week as need arises in the Association and Churches.
- 9) Due to the size of the Association and the rural setting of most of our Churches this agreement does not propose to regulate how many times the DOM can supply the pulpit, occasionally or successively in each Church, however, it is not in tended that the DOM will serve any Church as interim Pastor, but rather assist as requested by the Church in securing pulpit supply so that DOM time and attention can be equitably shared with other churches and Association responsibilities. It is suggested that the DOM compile and maintain a current list of licensed and ordained ministers, and lay speaker in the Association that are available for supply work.
- 10) The employment of the DOM shall be considered full time.
- 11) The Association treasurer will be the payroll officer and the DOM will report to the treasurer when vacation time and sick leave is used, so a record of leave may be maintained.

VI. SUPERVISION:

- 1) The DOM will be basically "self supervised".
- 2) The Missions committee will serve as an advisory committee to the DOM in all matters pertaining to terms of employ ment and this agreement.
- 3) The Association Executive Board will direct the Missions committee and the DOM, and the Association will be the final authority pertaining to all matters of the agreement

VII. MISCELLANEOUS:

- 1) All other working agreements which have been made between this Association and other DOM's are null and void.
- 2) This agreement shall be recorded annually in the Association minutes and may be amended as necessary by the Execu tive Board or in the annual meetings. Two months notice should be given before amendments are made. The DOM will be informed in writing of any proposed amendments two months before action is taken.

Minutes from the 64th Annual Session of the Truett Baptist Association

Thursday, October 2, 2014 First Baptist Church, Waverly

From six o'clock in the evening until six forty-five messengers gathered in the fellowship hall of the church for a meal and a wonderful time of fellowship.

At six forty-five Bro. Michael Mays, Music Minister of First Baptist Church Waverly led the gathered messengers in congregational singing. Following the congregational singing Dr. Richard Bray, pastor of First Baptist Church Waverly led in a time of devotion. He shared Matthew 28:18-20. He spoke about the importance of Biblical salvation and a correct view of evangelism.

After the time of devotion, moderator, Bro. David Deavers, pastor of Immanuel Baptist Church, gave thanks to the host church for the meal provided and also for hosting the annual meeting, then called the meeting to order.

Bro. David then introduced Bro. Tim Bearden, representative of the Tennessee Baptist Convention to share about Tennessee Missions and Ministries. The TBC report began by viewing a video of Dr. Randy Davis, Executive Director of the TBC, thanking us for supporting the Cooperative Program. He shared about the upcoming Summit, or the gathering of Tennessee Baptist's. He encouraged Tennessee Baptist to regain the passion and works that was what once made us what we are. Bro. Bearden then highlighted how grateful he was to serve in the state of Tennessee and would assist us in any way he could.

Following the TBC Report, Bro. David Deavers welcomed Bro. Jeff McGinnis, representative of the Tennessee Baptist Children's Home, to the floor. Bro. Jeff shared personal testimony of how individual children's lives had been changes since coming to the Children's Home. He also encouraged us to continue to support the ministry through prayer, service, and giving.

Next, a video was shared about "Yes on 1". This video highlighted the truth about abortion in Tennessee. It encouraged voters to take serious the responsibility before us during the next election to make a change in our state constitution.

Our Associational clerk, Sister Glee Smith was absent and recovering from a serious surgery, and in her place was Bro. Joe Shannon, Assoc. Director of Missions. He shared that a printed copy of the Summary of Executive Board Actions was in the Book of Report and could be reviewed, as well as the Digest of Church Letters, which is a compilation of the information gathered by the Annual Church Profiles. He also shared the Nominating Committee Report, as well as the Linkup Report. He shared about a decrease in funds receive from the TBC beginning in November to 'The Associations.' These reports were accepted as presented.

Bro. David Deavers, as Chairman of the Finance Committee, then presented the Treasurer's Report, Budget and Finance Committee Report, & Adoption of Budget. These reports and recommendations past as presented.

Bro. William Gray, Director of Mission, then shared his report. He highlighted that we as the Linkup, were working towards self sufficiency. The TBC would be decreasing the amount they gave by 6.1%. The Associations had already began supplementing the budget to prepare. However, this cut came as a surprise, and Bro. Gray hopes that communication between churches, associations, and state conventions will be strengthened in the coming days.

Sister Lee Lowe then read the Memorial Report as we remembered our brothers and sisters in Christ who have gone on before us to Glory, as well remember their families.

Bro. Michael Mays then led us in special music. Then various individuals gave mission trip reports from the past year. There were reports from: Disaster Relief experiences, 2 separate trips to Ecuador, and Chile.

We adjourned and closed in prayer.

Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes

Your Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes ministry celebrates its 40th anniversary on Dec. 2, 2014. How thankful we are to God for his provision and for Tennessee Baptists' faithfulness in supporting the good work of caring for senior adults and adults with developmental disabilities. The number 40 brings to mind several biblical references—it rained 40 days and nights while Noah was in the ark, the Israelites wandered in the wilderness 40 years after leaving Egypt, Jesus was tempted for 40 days in the wilderness, and Jesus appeared to his disciples for 40 days following his resurrection, to name four. In each case, 40 represented the completion of a significant period of time. For Adult Homes, the 40th year has been one of challenge and of hope, of trials and faith. And, we know that faith will lead us home! We have much to celebrate and to offer thanks for:

- We rejoice and give thanks for another excellent Special Friends Camp in July at Carson Springs and Linden Valley. A week of fun, friendship, Bible study and worship was experienced by 278 campers.
- We rejoice and give thanks for the 55 residents who make their homes in the six group homes for those with developmental disabilities.
- We rejoice and give thanks for the more than 300 residents on the three campuses for senior adults. These include those who are still very active and those who are frail and have health-care needs.
- We rejoice and give thanks for the new residents who are moving into Williams Ferry Pointe independent living community in Lenoir City.
- We rejoice and give thanks for those who are leading and contributing to the R.A.R.E. (Renovate a Room Everyone) Campaign to remodel and refurnish all the patient rooms at Baptist Health Care Center in Lenoir City.
- We rejoice and give thanks for the 2014 Father's Day Offering which helps underwrite the cost of care for the group home residents. At the time of writing, gifts were 3.5% ahead of the same time last year which gives us encouragement that the goal of \$350,000 will be reached.
- We rejoice and give thanks for the many volunteers and staff members who help with the residents and campers.
- We rejoice and give thanks that God has called Tennessee Baptists to the high and holy cause of caring for the least and last among us.

Forty years in human life is approaching mid-life whereas 40 years in the life of an institution is an unknown. It is our hope and prayer that God will continue to use the ministry of Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes for His honor and glory until that day when there will no longer be any disabilities, illnesses, frail bodies or minds, the day when all things are made new in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes, Inc. 2014 Association Report

During this year, your TBCH ministry has continued on trend with slight growth, serving approximately 200 children and their families through the residential care program. Additionally, 13 children have been led to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, and 18 students provided for as they pursue their college or post-secondary education.

After 123 years of success in providing residential care, God is calling us into a deeper season of ministry as we continue to grow our statewide foster care network. We've never felt more confident in the direction that the TBCH ministry is moving!

On November 6, 2013, Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes signed a n0-cost contract with the Tennessee Department of Children's Services to provide Foster Care (Resource) Homes for the State. This new opportunity further expands TBCH's role in "ministering the love of Jesus Christ to children and families in crisis." We've expanded our Foster Care staff across the three grand divisions and our Case Workers are working tirelessly to meet the ever growing need for foster parents. All across the state, people are participating in our PATH (Parents As Tender Healers) classes taught by the TBCH Foster Care team to become foster parents. Participants are joining from other denominations, as well! We are continuing to look to the local church to provide support to these new foster parents. Through meals, respite care, transportation assistance, encouragement, and – most certainly – prayer, the Caring Communities Ministry is critical for the success of this part of our ministry.

This growth and success has been possible due the faithful support of individuals and Tennessee's Baptist churches. As we continue to broaden our ministry, we must continue to broaden our support base. Please prayerfully consider your response to both the Mother's Day Offering and the Cooperative Program.

Amidst all the change surrounding our ministry, Dr. Bryant Millsaps has made the decision to retire at the end of 2015. An appointed committee of the TBCH Board of Trustees is currently searching for the candidate the Lord has already selected to replace Dr. Millsaps. We hope to have the President/Treasurer Elect named at the time of the Convention in November. Please be in prayer for this committee as they continue their search.

TENNESSEE DRUG AWARENESS REPORT Character Choices

The Tennessee Drug Awareness Council (TDAC) has developed a new ministry called Character Choices. This will be the name that we will be identified with as we move forward. Character Choices is under the umbrella of TDAC.

Character Choices has employed Tony Moore as our Character Coordinator. Tony is from Trenton, Tennessee where he lives. He is married and has been co-owner of a business for many years. He is active in the Salem Baptist Church where he serves faithfully. Tony states, "I am humbled by God's faithfulness and filled with anticipation to see what He has in store for us in the upcoming year."

The mission statement of Character Choices is "to build character and change the lives of students and society." We work with schools across the state and with churches to present a message about making right and healthy choices for Christ. We offer training prevention in the area of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, bullying and other areas where students are confronted with choices that will shape the direction of their lives.

Our success was made possible through the dedication and enthusiasm of our prevention specialists. Many of our prevention specialists are new recruits to the Character Choices (TDAC) family. We offer training for prevention specialists in using our modules. A recent training event was held in March. A major focus for the coming year will be to recruit and mobilize more specialists into the ministry so we can reach 20,000 students and provide resources for all family members, enabling them to make wise choices which when applied to life situations will produce lasting results and positive life changes.

We continue to recruit prevention specialists so that we can take the message of character development and drug prevention to children and youth in public or private schools across Tennessee, as well as to churches and youth groups.

We are truly excited about what God is doing with Character Choices, We have a Web site that is online and can be found at this address: www.characterchoices.org. We also have a Facebook page and we encourage you to visit us there.

One of our new ministry tools is Character Camps. Character Choices hosted its first Character Camp for boys, girls, men and women. The camp was held in Lavinia, TN at the Tennessee National Guard Training site. Union University students served as mentors, leaders and teachers for the weekend. The camp focused on Jesus, servanthood, helping others, education about drugs, smoking, and bullying.

Character Choices will continue to work with schools and churches this coming year and develop strategies to reach students with the message of character development. Annual Report for Associations in the Tennessee Baptist Convention Tennessee Woman's Missionary Union September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014

"The Story Lives On" was the 2013-14 emphasis theme for Woman's Missionary Union based on Acts 4:20. Tennessee WMU met in annual session April 5, 2014 at the Gatlinburg Convention Center. The weekend theme was "Boldly: Pray, Give, Witness, Go" with Leigh Gray, author from Carmi, Illinois as the keynote speaker for Missions Get-Together. Chandra Peele, New Hope author from Houston, Texas, was the keynote speaker for Connection. "Torches in the Corridor", the 125-year history of Tennessee WMU, by Dr. Melody Maxwell was introduced. Bobby Turner from First Baptist Church, Lenoir City was elected for her third year as President. Other officers elected include: Recording Secretary Elaine Pearson from Lebanon; and Vice Presidents: Delores Coffey, Morristown; Lynda Ryan, Hendersonville; and Andrea Young, Bolivar. State Acteens Advisory Panelists for 2013-14 included Susanna Clouse, Caney Fork Baptist Church, Cookeville; Hannah Schussler, Ebenezer Baptist Church, Greenbrier; Emily Bartlett, Caney Fork Baptist Church, Cookeville; and Chrissy Webber, Black Oak Baptist Church, Clinton. Registration for Missions Get-Together and Connection totaled 1,952. The annual offering totaled \$8,669.12 with 90% designated to send a team of State Acteen Panelists on a partnership missions trip to Italy in June; 10% benefited Tennessee N Touch Endowment at the WMU Foundation. The participants also contributed hygiene items to support shelters for victims of human trafficking in Tennessee. Promotion of Project HELP: Human Exploitation concluded in 2014.

Candy Phillips announced plans to retire December 31, 2014. President Bobby Turner appointed an Executive Director-Treasurer Search Committee: Chair Phyllis Cobb, Springfield; Vice Chair Shelby Lord, Lenoir City; Frank Green, Sparta; Rhonda Poore, Kenton; and Delores Coffey, Morristown.

Construction of the Missionary House on the property donated by Ann and Don Davis on John Hager Road in Mt. Juliet began in July, 2013. April 4 the TN WMU Executive Board approved a recommendation to name it "Mary's House" in memory of three former executive directors who served TN WMU a total of 61 years: Mary Northington (1923-53), Mary Mills (1953-67), and Mary Jane Nethery (1967-84). Guidelines were also approved that specify residency requirements and care of the property.

Currently there are 22 Christian Women's Job Corps and 7 Christian Men's Job Corps sites in Tennessee. The state coordinator is Tracey Gholson from Brook Hollow Baptist Church, Nashville. Baptist Nursing Fellowship is currently without leadership and did not meet in 2013-14. TN WMU accepted the responsibility to equip leaders of literacy ministries which include English as a second language, adult reading and writing and tutoring children and youth.

Former Executive Director-Treasurer, Katharine C. Bryan died October 26, 2013. She served as director from 1985-1998.

The first of several TN WMU prayer walking teams went to Italy in cooperation with the convention partnership. Shelby Lord, former president from Lenoir City, lead the team of five women April 21-May 1. Three State Acteen Panelists, two parents, and Julie Heath participated in a partnership missions trip to Italy June 26-July 3.

The 2013 goal for the Golden Offering for Tennessee Missions was \$1,600,000. The theme for the 2013 Week of Prayer for State Missions was "Focus Tennessee!" based on Mark 8:18. As of July 31, the total amount given to the 2013 GOTM was \$1,513,106. In addition to promoting the Golden Offering and the Cooperative Program, TN WMU is also responsible for promoting special missions offerings which this year totaled more than \$16,523,755.00:

The year 2014 was definitely a year of change for the Baptist & Reflector, the official newsjournal of the Tennessee Baptist Convention. In June the B&R transitioned from weekly to biweekly and is now a part of the TBC's Communications Team, led by Chris Turner, director of communications.

The paper is mailed to nearly 29,000 homes 26 weeks a year, reaching a potential readership of about 90,000 people.

In addition, the B&R has become one of the top two most viewed pages on the Tennessee Baptist Convention's website at www.tnbaptist.org. With the shift to a biweekly format, the goal is to increase the B&R's web presence. Plans to launch a new B&R website later this year are underway.

The paper's "virtual edition," launched in 2011, continues to reach a potential readership of about 14,000 more people every week.

The goal of the paper is to "tell the story of Tennessee Baptists" through news, feature stories and photographs. As in the past, the paper this year placed a major emphasis on what Tennessee Baptists are doing to reach the world for Christ by focusing on stories related to missions and evangelism. This year the paper has reported extensively on the TBC's 1-5-1 Harvest Plants effort to increase the number of baptisms in Tennessee.

With additional time to develop stories, the B&R staff plans more in-depth features on topics of concern for Tennessee Baptists and in-depth coverage of ministries funded through the Cooperative Program.

The Baptist and Reflector continued to utilize social media tools in 2014 such as Twitter. Editor Lonnie Wilkey regularly writes a blog that provides information for Tennessee Baptists between print issues.

The staff monitors trends that could affect Tennessee Baptists and prints those stories to keep readers informed. In addition, opinions, both from the editor and others, are printed and are intended to make readers think, reflect, and act.


